

Proposition 84 Statewide Park Program – Round One

Wilshire Center/Koreatown Central Park

This project will create the new Wilshire Center/Koreatown Central Park in the City of Los Angeles through acquisition and development of a .69 acre parcel and construction of a new playground, playfield, sports court, community garden, walking loop with exercise stations, and picnic area.

Through community based planning meetings, youth, seniors, and families selected these features. Additional design ideas from residents to be included in the project are:


- Walking loop with exercise stations not made of asphalt or concrete, community garden, green space with real grass, not synthetic turf.
- Place toddler and school aged playgrounds together at Southern portion of site; Place sports courts at North end of site; place community garden at South end of site.
- Make park attractive to many groups throughout the day; keep park open with limited fencing at playground and community garden.
- For park beautification, create a multi-lingual multi-cultural art welcoming arch over the park entrance. Use multi-colored shade-sails. 10 residents will create a mural.
- 35 residents will participate in tree planting, community garden creation, and other landscaping.

The project will include the following sustainable techniques:

- Subterranean drip irrigation using a controller with rain and moisture sensors.
- Permeable surfaces and bioswales.
- 10% recycled materials to be used for park construction.
- Non-invasive, drought tolerant plants.
- LED lighting, photovoltaic shade panels, light colored paving, locally sourced materials, collect runoff from site.

The park will be open every day and night with no use fees.
