

## Chinese Gambling Hall

## Chinese General Store

### Amador County

- **The Chinese Gambling Hall and the Chinese General Store** are located within the Fiddletown National Register District and recorded as California Historical Landmark No. 35.
- **The Chinese Gambling Hall**, constructed in the late 1850s or early 1860s, is an extremely rare example of brick buildings built by and for Chinese in the California Mother Lode region.
- **The Chinese General Store**, although used by a Chinese merchant, appears to have been constructed by Euro-American designers or builders in the mid-to-late 1850s. Two-stories high and built of rock, the building was one of the early permanent structures in Fiddletown.

### Project Scope:

- Stabilize and preserve both buildings; repair or replace as necessary roof, walls, windows, doors, foundation, and drainage to prevent future deterioration.
- Conduct an archaeological surface assessment of the area immediately surrounding and within both building as well as archaeological excavations in the location of any required drainage trenches. Any artifacts discovered will be cataloged and preserved.
