

Picchetti Ranch Winery Building Seismic Upgrade

Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District





Picchetti Ranch Cupertino, CA

- Listed in the National Register of Historic Places
- The Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District acquired the Picchetti Ranch in 1976 from the Picchetti family who settled there around 1880 and built the winery and ranch buildings. The winery is one of eight surviving historic structures, most of which are used in the production of wine. The masonry construction is unique among the ranch buildings as all of the others are built of wood. The stone walled cellar of the winery building is used for barrel-aging of the wine with the upper floor housing the tasting and sales room and as a venue for small events.
