- Listed in the National Register of Historic Places
- "Los penasquitos" means "little cliffs" and refers to the rugged palisades which rim the Los Penasquitos Canyon Preserve. This magnificent site occupies a portion of San Diego's earliest land grant. The Los Penasquitos site has been continuously occupied for seven thousand years, first as a village site of the Kumeyaay people and then as the elegant Rancho Santa Maria de Los Penasquitos. Archaeological excavations over the past 15 years have produced thousands of artifacts. Grant funds will be used to develop a traveling exhibit using artifacts and photographs to depict a day from the perspectives of Native American, Mexican-Californian, and American women.
