

- The Torres-Martinez Desert Cahuilla Indian Nation is a federally recognized tribal government and is one of six Indian Reservations established by Executive Order of President Ulysses S. Grant on May 20, 1876.
- The Torres-Martinez Historical District consist of three buildings believed to be the oldest standing Indian Agency buildings in the State of California.
- The old Bureau of Indian Affairs schoolhouse was built in 1907 and served as part of the center of Tribal activities.
- The Torres-Martinez Historical District was placed on the National Register of Historic Places on May 17, 1973 and is a California Point of Historical Interest.
