

- Designed by Comstock and Trotsche and built in 1887 for Jesse Shepherd, spiritualist, musician and author, the Villa Montezuma is an outstanding historical example of late nineteenth century Queen Anne architectural style.
- The San Diego Historical Society turned Villa Montezuma over to the City of San Diego in 1971 to be operated by the Society as a public museum. A fire destroyed a portion of the Villa in 1986 necessitating repairs and restoration.
- The Villa was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1971.
