#### **Trail Planning & Grant Writing**

Interested in learning how to prepare a successful trail grant application? A combination of field and classroom exercises will take you from sustainable trail planning and layout to the details and strategies of successful grant preparation.

#### **Trail User Conflict Resolution**

What happens when three or more user groups are sharing the same trail? With the popularity of shared use trails comes the challenge of user conflict. Join a group of equestrians, mountain bikers and hikers on an interactive and extremely informative field experience of trail etiquette techniques.

#### **Santa Monica Mountains NRA Backbone Trail Tour**

Join trail planners from the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area on a tour of portions of the 65-mile Backbone Trail. Learn about the trail's history, visit trailheads, a future backcountry camp location, and enjoy an invigorating walk on the trail. The tour route traverses some twisty roads and includes a 4 mile hike.

#### **Recreational Trail Funding Opportunities**

Learn about the Recreational Trails grant program (RTP), how to develop a competitive trail project proposal and how to apply the basic development strategies to your proposed trails. A panel of California State Park grant administrator and trail developers will outline grant application requirements, proposal strategies, and share technical strategies and pitfalls of recreational trail development.

#### **GIS/GPS Principles in Trail Use**

Learn the basics of GPS and equipment. See how GPS can be used to document trail locations and features. Experience

how GPS-GIS data maintenance can update information about features locations and become a tool for maintenance and repair at a cost savings to trail managers.

### **Santa Monica Mountains NRA Trails Management Plan**

Learn how this collaboration of federal, state, and local governments, disparate trail user organizations, and environmental group's were able to craft a large scale trail system blueprint for the future. The panel will share how, with nearly 500 miles of existing formal and informal trails, and a multiplicity of local, state, and federal jurisdictions and private lands, a comprehensive plan has been developed.

### **Preserving Public Trail Access**

The public's right to get to and use trails is an ongoing struggle in many regions of the state as landowners or homeowners associations may seek to privatize trail entry points or cut off access to even historic recreation trails. Join a panel of legal experts who have been working to ensure that established trail plans can be implemented and the public's legal access is protected.

### **Working Effectively with Trail Maintenance Volunteers**

This workshop is designed to provide participants with the nuts and bolts on how to develop a trail maintenance program for volunteers. Participants will walk away with useful information on design, training techniques and a how-to demonstration program for volunteers. Attendees of this session should have a basic understanding of trail maintenance work.

### **Accessibility Guidelines for Trails & Outdoor Developed Areas**

What is an accessible trail? How do I know if my proposed or existing trails meet these guidelines? Do all trails need to meet these guidelines? Get the answer to these questions and more as the details of this rulemaking process continues. A Federal Access Board Representative will share the details of the proposed guidelines for Outdoor Recreation Areas under the Architectural Barriers Act.


