#### **COMMENT CARDS**

- Better trail access out of Green Valley Falls level/ Better sites at Breen Valley Falls Horse camp on the new parcels (north site of park). North end of Park
- No fees at Sweetwater Bridge.
- Represent the public interest! Let us use the trail machine to clear trails
- Hual-cu-cuish Day [use?]; Horse use development
- Expand usage of ‘Oroflame Trail’
- Staff must be open (no secrets); no secret meetings – open minded to negotiation & spirit of the law.
- Public access must have equal representation at all meetings by a professional park staff person.
- More access points
- Equestrian camping, trails, & parking,
- Interpretive signs for cultural, historical, & natural resources along trails
- CRSP is magnificent – shout it out!
- Did I mention more horse camps & horse trailer parking?
- CRHT – where does it stand?
- Equestrians frequent this park from all over S. Cal. As a prime equestrian camp & riding destination. So few are available. It needs to be written into the G.P. that equestrian camping & usage is a major service. Still desperately need a ‘no horse’ family camp.
- Permanent day use area @ Hual-cu-cuish
- Family horse camp in northern part – maybe stonewall or along Los Vaq. Rd.
- Be careful with multi-use trails (speed & site)
- How to make a corridor in the Wilderness. Need more multi-use.

- I am not a horse owner or a mountain biker. I believe this park should be protected for all people for all time – not just for a small vocal minority. As the sprawl continues to intensify across Southern California, it is critical that parks protect the ecosystems, the wildlife. Please don't turn this park into a "Mission Trails East."
- I am the chair of the Cuyamaca Sponsor Group, an advisory group for San Diego County Planning Dept. I didn't receive a notice for this meeting. Was the school camp invited? Please plan for a snow play park with parking. Please take down & no more towers on Cuyamaca Peak or anywhere.
- Parking fees should not be a requirement for citizens to enjoy our park. Solicit for more volunteers to offset park expenses. Learn to use resources available.
