California State Parks Announces Granite Bay Food Service Concession Opportunity at Folsom Lake State Recreation Area

SACRAMENTO, Calif. –California State Parks is accepting proposals for a five-year Granite Bay food service concession contract with the option to extend for an additional five years at Folsom Lake State Recreation Area (SRA). Proposals are being accepted starting April 15, 2022 through June 30, 2022, by 2 p.m.

Granite Bay is the largest and most popular entrance into the Folsom Lake SRA providing access to launch ramps, equestrian staging areas, hiking and mountain biking trails. The Main Beach area is the largest beach and swim area in the park and provides family and group picnic facilities, restrooms and lifeguard service during the peak season.
