## State Indian Museum Presents Native Education Series in Celebration of Women's History Month

**SACRAMENTO, Calif.** – In celebration of National Women's History Month, the California State Parks and the State Indian Museum are proud to present a Native Education for All Series: *Lesla Phillip Roberts -- The Life of a Choctaw Woman, 1889-1994* on Saturday, March 14, from 1 to 2:30 p.m.

As a special guest, Dr. Charles Roberts, Professor Emeritus of California State University, Sacramento, will present the life story of his grandmother – a Choctaw woman whose life encompassed the 1906 dissolution of the Choctaw Nation, 2<sup>nd</sup> great removal of the Mississippi Choctaws to Indian Territory in Oklahoma, and Indian dispersal to California in the 1920s.

The special presentation is free to Museum guests with paid admission: \$3 for adults, \$2 for youths ages 6-17 and free for children five and under. The State Indian Museum is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and is located at 2618 K Street in Sacramento.
