*The California State Indian Museum is operated by California State Parks and supported by the Sacramento Historic Sites Association. Open daily from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. for self-guided tours and school group visits, the museum is located in midtown Sacramento at **2618 K Street on the grounds of Sutter's Fort State Historic Park**. The museum displays exhibits and artifacts illustrating the cultures of the state's earliest inhabitants, from the traditions of the ancestors to contemporary Native artwork.*

*Artifacts on display in the museum include basketry, beadwork, clothing, and exhibits about the ongoing traditions of various California Native American groups. Current exhibits include dance regalia of the Northwest Coast tribes and another on Ishi, reputedly the last of the Yahi people. Open daily, the museum hosts special events throughout the year.
