23rd Annual Sutter's Fort Living History by Candlelight — An Evening at the Fort, 1846

Where: *Sutter's Fort State Historic Park, 2701 L Street, Sacramento*

When: Saturday Evening, November 17, 2007

It's a November evening, you quietly "eavesdrop" on the conversations and evening tales of the pioneers occupying Capt. John Sutter's fort in New Helvetia. The hustle and bustle of midtown Sacramento melts away and in its place the soft glow of candlelight welcomes you to life in the 1840's. Ticket reservations begin Monday, October 15, 2007 for the 23rd Annual Sutter's Fort Living History by Candlelight – An Evening at the Fort, 1846. This theater-like program takes place only once each year, November 17, 2007 at Sutter's Fort State Historic Park in Sacramento. Reservations may be made by calling 916.445.5527

The adventure begins when guests enter the candlelit fort, circa 1846. (Indoor lighting won't be a reality for years!) All the contemporary electric lights have been doused to enable visitors to truly feel the atmosphere of the past. Tall tales, gossip, rumors and evening work take place as visitors follow their lantern-carrying guide through the fort's rooms and courtyards.

A continuously evolving play unfolds as visitors to the fort peer into the fort's rooms for short 5-minute "acts" that provide glimpses of life on the frontier. At the conclusion of the hour-and-a-half tour visitors enjoy pie and cider or coffee in a souvenir "tin cup" with Captain Sutter in the Central Building of the Fort.

The Sutter's Fort State Historic Park Living History volunteers portray people of Sutter's Fort going about their evening tasks as if it were November 1846. California State Parks, with support from the Sacramento Historic Sites Association, presents the Sutter's Fort Living History Program.

Evening tours begin every 10 minutes from 6:30 until 8:00 p.m. rain or shine. Tickets are \$15 per person, and non-refundable. Call 916.445.5527 for reservations beginning October 15, 2007. Space is limited and tours sell-out early.

About Sutter's Fort State Historic Park

Operated by California State Parks with financial assistance from the nonprofit Sacramento Historic Sites Association, Sutter's Fort State Historic Park is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Located in midtown Sacramento on L Street between 26th and 28th Streets, the Fort offers special events and living history programs throughout the year. Established in 1839 by Swiss immigrant John Augustus Sutter, Sutter's Fort was at the center of a flourishing agricultural empire named New Helvetia (New Switzerland.) This empire established Sacramento's earliest settlement and the first non-Indian settlement in California's Central Valley.
