“Time Travel Weekends” Continue in Old Sacramento
Offered by the Historic Old Sacramento Foundation,
The New Street Theatre Program Continues through August

OLD SACRAMENTO, Calif. -- “Time Travel Weekends,” a new and exciting street theatre program, continues to delight and engage visitors to Old Sacramento with changing and fun-filled themes. For the next two weekends -- July 10 & 11 and July 17 & 18 -- the performances will feature politicians, patent medicine men and other “purveyors of pomposity.” With this new weekend program, the streets of Old Sacramento are populated with teams of talented performers in period attire who put on spontaneous and often-elaborate skits so visitors can step back in time to the 1850s-1870s.

For the next two weekends, Old Sacramento guests will enjoy politicians from an earlier time as they publicly and passionately debate issues of the day and convincing medicine men on street corners and stages as they peddle all kinds of interesting quick-cures for all that ails you. Plus, guests are encouraged to greet real life characters on the shaded boardwalks of Old Sacramento such as Lola Montez, Leland Stanford, Black Bart, and little Lotta Crabtree, to name a few.

Continuing on weekends through August, visitors to Old Sacramento can enjoy free historic re-enactments complete with heroes and villains, damsels in distress, children’s pioneer craft activities, historic sports, gambling, re-enactments of the Pony Express, military encampments, parades, historic events, medicine shows, musicians, dancers and jugglers. Additionally, the New Golden Melodeon Revue performs a Gold Rush-era variety show at the Eagle Theatre at 2:30 p.m.

The new “Time Travel Weekends” in Old Sacramento are free to the public and are available on weekends through August from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. The new program is designed to bring a lively and theatrical flair to the streets of Old Sacramento and reflect the exciting atmosphere and character of the early gold mining period.
