Coastal Trail and Glass Beach Update

The Bad News Public access to Glass Beach will be closed from August 18th thru November 30 for construction.

The Good News The City will construct a new \$6 million 93 acre park on the vacant industrial parcel south of Glass Beach. The Project will open up 3.5 miles of Fort Bragg's coastline for recreational activities.

Key improvements include:

1. Restoration of 20+ acres of asphalt and packed gravel into native habitat;
2. Construction of 4.5 miles of new multi-use and pedestrian-only trails stretching from Pudding Creek Trestle Bridge to the Noyo Bridge;
3. Construction of two new parking lots with two welcome plazas and restrooms;
4. The existing gravel road to Glass Beach will be resurfaced as a multi-use trail.
