Guided Nature walk Saturday, May 14th at Anderson Marsh State Historic Park

Guided Nature Walks continue at Anderson Marsh State Historic Park.
The next scheduled walk is Saturday, May 14th.

The May walk will be led by California Naturalist and Park Docent Nicola Selph. Weather and trail condition permitting, Nicola plans on exploring three of the habitats found at the Park: the creek-side habitat of the Cache Creek Nature Trail and boardwalk, the grasslands of the Anderson Flats Trail and the oak woodlands of the Ridge Trail. Trees are leafing out and flowers are blooming; birds, dragonflies and other insects are becoming active. The walk should last between one and a half to two hours.

There will not be a Ranch House tour after this month's nature walk.

Bring binoculars and meet in front of the Ranch House at 8:15am for time to experience the early morning wildlife to be found in the Ranch House and Barn complex yard – the walk will begin at 8:30am. There is no charge and parking is free for those attending this event. Rain will cancel the walk.
