Come see what the end of spring has brought to Anderson Marsh State Historic Park

Anderson Marsh State Historic Park continues to hold monthly guided nature walks, followed by a tour of the Historic Ranch House Museum.

The next walk is scheduled for Saturday morning June 14th. Park Docents and AMIA Board members Gae Henry & Henry Bornstein will lead the guided walk & Ranch House tour. This month's walk will focus on how the land has been affected by the people who have lived at Anderson Marsh, including Native Americans, European Settlers and more modern inhabitants. The walk will include parts of the Ridge, Marsh and Cache Creek trails and will not be ADA accessible

The early spring rains have encouraged wildflowers that can be observed in the grasslands and along the oak ridges. Bring binoculars and meet in front of the Ranch House at 8:15am for time to experience the early morning wildlife to be found in the Ranch House and Barn complex yard – the walk begins at 8:30am.

The walk will last approximately 2 ½ to 3 hours and the tour of the historic Ranch House Museum will begin immediately after the walk. There is no charge and parking is free for those attending this event.
