McNee Ranch, also known as Montara Mountain, is a part of Montara State Beach. The mountain is a northern spur of the Santa Cruz Mountains and features the only undisturbed Coastal Mountain Habitat found over 100 miles of coastline

You are invited to take a naturalist-led walk through time along the Gray Whale Cove Trail. The walk will cover about 3 miles round-trip. The Trail parallels Highway 1 and only has a small gain in elevation at the beginning. Your guides, State Parks Rangers and docents will lead you along the Gray Whale Cove Trail and interpret the rich history of this area.



Directions:

Meet at the trailhead at the north end of the Gray Whale Cove Trail. This parking area is on the eastern side of Highway 1 across from Gray Whale Cove State Beach. The beach is located about 20 miles south of San Francisco and eight miles north of Half Moon Bay.

There is no parking fee but the lot can be very busy on weekends.

The weather can be changeable; layered clothing is recommended.

After the walk, you'll enjoy local produce and receive a tote bag with information about California State Parks. You'll also receive a 150th Anniversary pin.
