

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

**Nitrate Monitoring & Reporting Requirements Not Met for
 CSP-Limekiln – Water System #2710306**

Our water system failed to monitor as required for nitrate during calendar year 2013 and, therefore, was in violation of the regulations. Even though this failure was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what we did to correct this situation.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During the calendar year of 2013, we did not collect and report a nitrate sample result from Well 01 and therefore, cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time. In response, a nitrate sample was collected on February 12, 2014 from Well 01. The sampling result of <1 mg/L shows that the nitrate level is less than the maximum contaminant level of 45 mg/L and therefore, meets compliance with nitrate monitoring and reporting requirements for calendar year 2014.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time.
- The table below lists the contaminant(s) we did not properly test for during the last year, how many samples we are required to take and how often, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

What happened? What is being done?

We have since taken the required samples, as described in the last column of the table above. The samples showed we are meeting drinking water standards.”

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days [Health and Safety Code Section 116450(g)]:

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.
- BUSINESS PROPERTY OWNERS, MANAGERS, OR OPERATORS: Must notify employees of businesses located on the property.
