Where: Lake Natoma, Negro Bar day use area

News note to photo and assignment editors: This event has grown each year since its inception three years ago and will include volunteers, including divers, both on land and on the scenic waters of Lake Natoma.

Volunteers will be treated to a barbecue and prizes will be awarded to various categories involved in the cleanup effort. Directions: From Sacramento, take Highway 50 East to Hazel Avenue. Go left (north) on Hazel, over the river. Go right at Sunset. When Sunset ends, take a left at the stop sign (Main Avenue). Take a right on Madison. Go through the light at Greenback and start down the hill toward Folsom. The entry to Negro Bar is on the right (there will be a big stone sign with a Bear). Enter the park and stay to the right, all the way to the end (day use area).

From Folsom area, get to the corner of Greenback/Folsom Boulevard/Auburn-Folsom Road (new Folsom Bridge over Lake Natoma). Go toward Orangevale on Greenback and turn left into Negro Bar; follow instructions above to day use area.
