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## **California State Historical Resources Commission To Consider Properties for Action**

**WHAT:** California State Historical Resources Commission will consider eight nominations for federal and state historic designation. **National Register of Historic Places** nominations scheduled for action include:

**Kennedy Mine Historic District**      **Jackson (vicinity) Amador County**  
*Significant at State level as an example of quartz mining operations during California's signature mining era*

**Monterey County Courthouse**      **Salinas**      **Monterey County**  
*Significant at the local level as an excellent example of WPA Moderne architecture and art*

**Pacific Electric Building**      **Los Angeles**      **Los Angeles County**  
*Significant at the local level for its association with the Pacific Electric Railway*

**Uptown Tenderloin Historic District**      **San Francisco**      **San Francisco County**  
*Significant at the local level as a largely intact, visually consistent, inner-city high-density residential area*

**National Register of Historic Places** nominations scheduled for discussion and action:

**Torrey Pines Gliderport**  
**(Boundary Increase)**      **San Diego**      **San Diego County**  
*Boundary increase to include the historic approach surfaces*

**California Point of Historical Interest** nomination scheduled for action:

**Tallman Hotel**      **Upper Lake**      **Lake County**  
*The last remaining hotel building constructed in Upper Lake associated with its heyday as a bustling commercial center and transportation hub for the area's hot springs tourist industry*

**California Register of Historical Resources** nominations scheduled for discussion and action:

**Flower Drive Historic District**      **Los Angeles**      **Los Angeles County**  
*An example of 1920s multiple family housing in the Mediterranean Revival style*

*Significant for its role in the military defense of the Los Angeles Harbor and the Metropolitan Los Angeles area from 1914 through 1975*
