California State Parks Assumes Full Operations At Kings Beach State Recreation Area

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Today, California State Parks officially assumes operations and maintenance of Kings Beach State Recreation Area (SRA). State Parks looks forward to working with the community, and bringing the Department’s resources to Kings Beach.

“The experience, resources and expertise California State Parks brings to Kings Beach, coupled with decades of local knowledge, history and community involvement will provide the background for a successful transition and a bright future for the area,” said General Anthony L. Jackson, director of California State Parks. “Our department is very excited to become part of such a great community and we are looking forward contributing to the success of Kings Beach.”

Hours of operation will remain the same as before (6:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.) and Day Use fees will remain at \$10. State Parks will accept the day passes issued by NTPUD until further notice. Kings Beach SRA and its parking lot will remain open and accessible year-round. In addition, Park Ranger and Parks seasonal staff presence will begin immediately, and the park will begin operating under State Parks rules and regulations and local county Ordinances.

The parking lot at Kings Beach is currently impacted by the Kings Beach community revitalization project construction. The construction is part of a revitalization project that will last through the summer. We advise visitors to be cautious when walking by and driving through the construction zones. In the near future, State Parks and the CTC will be engaging with the Community, Placer County and other regional and local partners and stakeholders to work through improvement of the pier. Final upgrades should be consistent with the Community Plan Updating Process and the needs of the local community.

Since the North Tahoe Public Utilities District (NTPUD) decision to cease operations and maintenance on May 15th, the NTPUD and State Parks have worked closely together to ensure a smooth transition.
