History Comes Alive at Coloma Gold Rush Live

COLOMA, Calif. – “Coloma Gold Rush Live” at Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park will be a weekend celebration focused on California’s rich gold rush history. The event will take place Saturday, October 10-11 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Visitors will experience life in the 1850’s tent town through hands-on participation in gold panning, children’s games, pioneer school, wagon loading and much more. There will be 1850’s music, and James Marshall telling of his discovery of gold that will carry visitors back in time.

In addition, the tent town will be bustling with an exciting gallery of images and sounds associated with timber framing, cannon firing, cemetery players, a church service, saloon, bath house and a medicine show.

Finally, there will be a special dedication of a replica of a historic Hiram Young overland wagon.
