California State Parks to Hold Public Meeting on Proposed Developments to Mount Tamalpais State Park

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – California State Parks invites the public to attend one of two September 28 meetings to comment on proposed developments to Mount Tamalpais State Park. The department has been conducting a change in use analysis of the park’s Easy Grade Trail and plans on making ADA improvements to the historic Sidney B. Cushing Memorial Amphitheatre. Meetings include a tour of the proposed developments.

Just north of San Francisco's Golden Gate is Mount Tamalpais. The park has redwood groves and oak woodlands with a spectacular view from the 2,571-foot peak. More than 50 miles of hiking trails are within the park and connect to a larger, 200 mile long trail system. The Sidney B. Cushing Memorial Amphitheatre was constructed by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the 1930s. The natural-stone amphitheater seats 3,750 people and features the Mountain Play
