Springtime in Coloma: A 49'er Extravaganza

Coloma, CA – Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park will host a weekend celebration focused on the 125th Anniversary of Marshall's Monument which will also include a Mother's Day Victorian Tea and Brunch along with a living history Tent Town. The event will take place on Saturday, May 9 and Sunday, May 10 from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., and is open to the public.

On Saturday, May 9 at 11:00 a.m., the Native Sons and Native Daughters of the Golden West will dedicate a plaque at the monument for the 125th Anniversary followed by a barbeque.

Then on Sunday, May 10 at 10:00 a.m. a church service in the historic Emmanuel Church will take place followed by the Victorian Tea and Brunch at 11:00 a.m. The Victorian Tea and Brunch tickets will be sold in advance at <http://marshallgold.com>

Both days, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., will feature the 1850's Tent Town with living history, gold panning, wagon rides, saloon, and portrait studio. Gifts for Mother's Day can be purchased at the "Sweet Shoppe" and "Flower Shoppe" as well.
