DPR Seeks Public Input Regarding Millerton Lake Marina Concession

FRIANT, Calif. – The California Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) in partnership with the Bureau of Reclamation (BOR) seek public input on the future of the marina concession located within Millerton Lake State Recreation Area. A public meeting will be held Monday, July 10, at 6 p.m., in the Millerton Lake SRA Courthouse, 5290 Millerton Road, Friant.

Millerton Lake is nestled in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada, approximately 12 miles east of the city of Fresno. With over 40 miles of shore land for water sports, this state recreation area offers visitors swimming, fishing and boating opportunities. The hills surrounding the lake provide good hiking trails. During the winter season, the park has special boat tours to view the bald eagles.

In an effort to better serve visitors at Millerton Lake's marina, DPR plans to issue a Request for Proposals for a new concession contract through a competitive bid process. Input from the public meeting scheduled on Monday, July 10, will aid officials in planning the marina's future facilities and operations.
