Monterey State Historic Park Goes Back in Time

Experience Monterey as it was in the 1840s by participating in the Monterey Living History Day on July 4 from noon to 4 p.m. Activities for all ages begin after the 4th of July Parade in downtown Monterey.

Living History Day activities include children's games, rope-making, blacksmithing, leather stamping, weaving, cooking, butter-churning, and tortilla-making. Also scheduled are living history characters and authentic dances from the 1840s in the Cooper-Molera barn, a period drum and fife corps, storytelling, and a lemonade stand to quench your thirst.

Living History Day admission is \$2 for adults and \$1 for those 6-17 years old. Ages 5 and under are free if accompanied by an adult. This special event, sponsored by California State Parks in cooperation with the Old Monterey Preservation Society, will take place at the Cooper-Molera Adobe, 525 Polk Street, located at the junction of Munras, Polk and Alvarado streets in downtown Monterey.
