EXAMINATION INFORMATION

TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE (T&E) EXAMINATION

The examination is based solely on your Training and Experience. The Training and Experience (T&E) Examination is weighted 100%. To obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum score of 70% must be received.

Filing deadline to complete the T&E Examination is **October 23, 2015**. The link to this examination will not be available after that point.

FINAL FILING DATE

Required: A hard copy of your completed T&E Examination and a State Application (STD Form 678) must be mailed and postmarked or hand delivered no later than **October 23, 2015**, the **final filing date**. **Packets postmarked or personally delivered after the final filing date will not be accepted for any reason.**

SPECIAL TESTING ARRANGEMENTS

If you have a disability and need special testing arrangements, mark "yes" on Question #2 on the Examination and/or Employment application. The Selections Unit will contact you to make special testing arrangements. If you have not been contacted prior to receiving a notice to appear for the examination, please contact the Exam Analyst at (916) 651-0438.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A departmental statewide eligible list will be established for the Department of Parks and Recreation. This list will be abolished 12 months after it is established unless the needs of the service and conditions of the list warrant a change in this period.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by **October 23, 2015**, the **final filing date**.

NOTE: Accepted applicants are required to bring either a photo identification card or two forms of signed identification to each phase of the examination.

All applications/resumes must include "from" and "to" employment dates (month/day/year), time base, and applicable civil service class titles. Applications/resumes received without this information will be rejected.

If education is required to meet the minimum qualifications, include on the application (question #13) the name and location of the institution, course of study, units completed (semester/quarter), diploma, degree, or certificate obtained, and date completed. **Note: Applicants who are hired from the employment list must provide their official transcripts from the applicable institution(s) if education is used to meet the minimum qualifications.**

Acceptable course work and degrees must be completed at a regionally accredited institution. Course work completed in other states is acceptable as long as the institution holds regional accreditation through an accrediting body. Course work and degrees completed outside of the United States must be evaluated by an approving foreign transcript evaluation agency before they may be used for credentialing purposes.

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MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the requirements stated include more than one pattern and are distinguished as "**Either**" I, "**Or**" II, "**Or**" III, etc. For example, candidates possessing qualifying experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern I, and additional experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern II, may be admitted to the examination as meeting 100% of the overall experience requirement.

Education: Two years of college, including a combination of at least 15 units in any of the following fields museum studies, history, anthropology, art, archeology, or natural science. (Experience may be substituted for the required education on a year- for-year basis.)

And

Either I

One year of experience in the California state service performing the duties of a Museum Custodian, Range B.

Or II

Two years of experience in the maintenance and preservation of artifacts in a museum facility.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

Under direction, Museum Technicians perform cleaning, preservation, and minor restoration duties. Incumbents in this class regularly use specialized preservation procedures and materials to maintain antiques, furnishings, and other objects of historical or artistic values, perform skilled tasks in the maintenance and preservation of museum facilities housing artifacts and art objects; conduct basic research, and are responsible for the cataloguing and maintenance of artifact inventories. This class is intended for use in museum facilities requiring collections handling.

CONFIDENTIALITY AND SECURITY

Pursuant to Government Code Sections 19680(c) and 19681(b) it is unlawful to copy and/or furnish confidential examination material for the purpose of either improving or injuring the chances of any person or to obtain examination questions or other examination material before, during, or after an examination. Every person violating these provisions is guilty of a misdemeanor, and adverse action will be pursued. This may result in the person being barred from competition in future examinations, withheld from certification lists, or cancellation of eligibility for employment in state civil service.

EXAMINATION SCOPE

Knowledge of:

1. Methods, equipment, and materials used in the care and preservation of historic facilities.
2. Special techniques required for cleaning and preserving museum objects (including wood, marble, textiles, paper, and metal items).
3. Safety measures.
4. Use of chemicals, pesticides.
5. Registration procedures.
6. Artifact packing and handling.

Ability to:

1. Conduct registration procedures.
2. Handle valuable objects and works of art.
3. Capacity to lift and carry weights of at least 35 pounds.
4. Keep records.
5. Follow instructions.
6. Learn proper methods of preservation procedures in handling artifacts.
7. Exercise unusual care and judgment in the performance of assigned duties.

JOB CHARACTERISTICS

The Museum Technician class is intended to perform work which significantly consists of preservation and restoration tasks requiring skilled care of artifacts as compared to custodial and semiskilled maintenance work performed by the Museum Custodian class.

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VETERANS' PREFERENCE

Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows:

1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veteran's preference.
2. An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination.
3. Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

CAREER CREDITS

Career credits are not granted in open examinations.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the Selection Unit of the Department of Parks and Recreation, (916) 651-0438, three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received a progress notice.

Applications are available at Department of Parks and Recreation, California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) offices, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and online at jobs.ca.gov.

If you meet the requirements, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination described on this bulletin will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

The Department of Parks and Recreation reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned changes. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service laws and rules and all competitors will be notified.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history, and fingerprinting may be required.

Veterans' Preference: Veteran status is verified by the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR). Directions to apply for Veterans' Preference are on the Veterans' Preference Application ([CalHR 1093](#)), which is available at <https://jobs.ca.gov/job/veteransinformation>, and the Department of Veterans Affairs.
