**PROJECT TITLE:** RV Site Reconstruction

**LOCATION:** McArthur-Burney Falls Memorial State Park

**COUNTY:** Shasta

**DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:**

Reconstruct two recreational vehicle pads (RV Pads 1 and 2) that were formerly used for campground host trailers. The reconstructed RV pads will be used for seasonal park concession residences. To reconstruct the pads, grade and level the soil at the existing sites and move one of the two pads (Pad 1) east approximately 36 feet. 10 cubic yards of surface fill material will be spread at the pad sites to level them. Reconfigure and upgrade existing electrical, water and sewer services to separate the utilities at each RV pad site from an adjacent residence building. Following are the project components for utility services:

**Electrical:** Replace electrical meter on the existing power pole. Replace the existing conduit and wiring from the power pole to a new junction box and install new conduits to and meters at the two RV pads. Install a new meter at the existing residence to separate the electrical systems for the residence and each RV pad.

**Sewer:** Install a new leach field with an approximate surface area of 1,500 square feet and a depth of 30 inches. Replace approximately 100 feet of sewer line to the existing residence and 150 feet of lines to the RV pad sites.

**Potable Water:** The 30-foot long water system pipe will be replaced and a backflow device will be installed at each of the RV pads and residence.

Trenches for the sewer and potable water systems will measure approximately 12 inches wide by 18 inches deep. Trench and leach field excavation will be limited to previously disturbed areas. A Native American monitor or designated representative will be present during ground-disturbing work. Should any project activity result in exposure of archaeological resources, work will cease until the find has been evaluated and an appropriate data treatment program is designed and implemented. Such cultural resource management activities will be conducted by or under the supervision of a DPR-qualified archaeologist.
