PROJECT TITLE: Wood Burning Stove and Fence Installation at Park Residence

LOCATION: Point Lobos State Reserve, Highway One

COUNTY: Monterey

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Install a new wood burning stove with an outlet and a new outside fence and gate at Residence #5 in Pt. Lobos State Reserve to provide a heat source during electrical outages and enclose the residence and yard area. Work involves cutting an approximately 12 inch by 12 inch wide square hole in the ceiling; cutting an approximately 8 inch wide circular hole in the roof for installation of the ceiling box and pipe; and installing a triple wall pipe from the ceiling box through the attic and outside. On the roof the triple wall chimney pipe will be topped off with a cap with a spark arrestor, as well as two brackets mounted to the roof for stability. Weather stripping and flashing will also be installed around the base of the pipe. A standard 8 inch interior outlet will be placed in the southwest corner of the living room, allowing the stove to be positioned on a removable firebrick hearth at the minimum required distance from the wall in accordance with code standards. The new fence will be 70 feet long and be made from 12 redwood 4x4 posts with two 2x4 redwood stringers between each post and 1x6 redwood fence boards 6 foot tall and be constructed between the garage building and existing corner fence at the edge of the parking area and a gate installed where the asphalt pathway leads from the garage parking area to the house. New fence and gate will match existing fencing at this location.

REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT:

Project consists of installation of small new equipment and facilities in a small structure and the maintenance and repair of historical resources, in a manner consistent with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties with Guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, Restoring, and Reconstructing Historic Buildings (1995), Weeks and Grimmer, and is included as "activities affecting historic resources, consistent with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties" in the Department of Parks and Recreation's list of exempt activities, in accordance with CCR § 15300.4.
