PROJECT TITLE: Plumas Eureka Road and Trail Repairs

LOCATION: Plumas Eureka State Park

COUNTY: Plumas

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:

Repair existing damaged roads and trails from storm event at Plumas Eureka State Park using FEMA funding. Work includes:

- Headquarters Roads - Reconstruct 35 cubic yards of eroded road edge and surface to pre-disaster conditions. Grade and re-shape to provide out-slope and provide a durable surface.
- Water-tank Road - Reconstruct 155 cubic yards of eroded road edge and surface to pre-disaster conditions. Grade and re-shape to provide out-slope and provide a durable surface.
- Eureka Lake Road - Reconstruct 124 cubic yards of eroded road edge and surface to pre-disaster conditions. Grade and re-shape to provide out-slope and provide a durable surface.
- Red Dirt Roads - Reconstruct 171 cubic yards of eroded road edge and surface to pre-disaster conditions. Grade and re-shape to provide out-slope and provide a durable surface.
- Jamison Mine Area Trails - Trail maintenance from storm event. Remove down trees, re-shape and fill approximately 2711 feet of existing eroded trail. Fill approximately 115 cubic yards of eroded trail.
- Headquarters Trails - Trail maintenance from storm event. Remove down trees, re-shape and fill approximately 323 feet of eroded trail. Remove 654 of slide debris and re-construct damaged retaining walls. Reconstruct approximately 80 feet of causeway. Fill approximately 15 cubic yards of eroded trail.

In the event that human remains are discovered during project activity, existing law requires that project managers contact the county coroner. If the remains are determined to be of Native American origin, both the Native American Heritage Commission and any identified descendants shall be notified. In the event that previously undocumented cultural resources are encountered during project construction (including but not limited to dark soil containing shellfish, bone, flaked stone, groundstone, or deposits of historic trash), work within the immediate vicinity of the find will be temporarily halted or diverted until a DPR-qualified cultural resource specialist has evaluated the find and implemented appropriate treatment and disposition of the artifact(s).
