Species	Status	Habitat	Comments
<b>REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS</b>			
Southern torrent salamander <i>Rhacotriton variegatus</i>	CSC	Springs, seeps, and streams in coastal redwood, Douglas-fir, mixed conifer, montane riparian and montane hardwood-conifer habitats, old growth forest.	
Western tailed frog <i>Ascaphus truei</i>	CSC	Montane hardwood-conifer, redwood, Douglas-fir and ponderosa pine habitats.	
Northern red-legged frog <i>Rana aurora aurora</i>	CSC	Humid forests, woodlands, grasslands, and streamside in northwestern California.	
Northwestern pond turtle <i>Actinemys marmorata marmorata</i>	CSC	Ponds and small lakes with abundant vegetation. Also seen in marshes, slow moving streams, reservoirs, and occasionally brackish water.	
<b>BIRDS</b>			
Osprey <i>Pandion haliaetus</i>	CSC	Nesting – Ocean shores, bays, fresh-water lakes and rivers.	Known to occur within LRSB
Bank swallow <i>Riparia riparia</i>	ST	Breeding – Excavates nest burrows in steep riverbanks, gravel pits, and cut banks.	
Tufted puffin <i>Fratercula cirrhata</i>	CSC	Breed in colonies on islands with steep, grassy slopes or on cliff tops. Winter habitat is well offshore, in mid-ocean.	
Western snowy plover <i>Charadrius alexandrinus nivosus</i>	FT, CSC	Nesting and wintering – ocean shores, lake margins and rivers.	Known to occur within LRSB
Fork-tailed storm-petrel <i>Oceanodroma furcata</i>	CSC	Nests in burrows, natural cavities, or rock crevices on offshore islands..	
<b>MAMMALS</b>			
Sonoma tree vole <i>Arborimus pomo</i>	CSC	Occurs in old-growth and other forests, mainly Douglas-fir, redwood, and montane hardwood-conifer habitats.	
White-footed vole <i>Arborimus albipes</i>	CSC	Mature coastal forests, prefers small, clear streams with dense alder and shrub vegetation.

Coho salmon <i>Oncorhynchus kisutch</i>	FT, ST, CSC	Coastal waters and anadromous streams.	
Coastal cutthroat trout <i>Oncorhynchus clarkii clarkii</i>	CSC	Coastal waters and anadromous streams.	
Tidewater goby <i>Eucyclogobius newberryi</i>	FE, CSC	Coastal waters and estuaries.
