PROJECT TITLE: Eagle Point Campground Rehabilitation and Erosion Control

LOCATION: Emerald Bay State Park

COUNTY: El Dorado

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Rehabilitate Eagle Point Campground in Emerald Bay State Park to improve erosion control, provide improved access to campsites and lakeshore. Work will include:

Excavate 2 feet in depth by 3 feet in width by various lengths and construct rock lined ditches along roadways and campsites to improve drainage and reduce sediment flow. Grade and repair existing approximately 2250' long x 10' wide fire road near site # 84 to control erosion; install ADA compliant benches at overlook areas; replace all water bibbs with ADA water bibbs and provide access to water bibbs near existing ADA campsites #73A and #74A. Provide for stabilization and compaction of ground surface in campsites and stabilized erosion resistant paths of travel to facilities; install permanent BMP's where needed. Construct rock walls in campsites to control erosion due to topography. Construct sediment basins to control run off and erosion.

Sites #1 Thru #34

- Excavate to border all campsite parking spurs with 4X6 redwood and re-pave with $\frac{1}{2}$ " mix asphalt at a 2" compaction rate.
- Replace old fire rings and other camp furniture as needed with new Americans with Disabilities Act Standards (ADA) compliant ones.
- Grade and install class 2 road base; compact to improve accessibility at each campsite.

Sites #35 Thru #100

- Remove sites # 37, #40, #50 and # 54.
- Convert part of campsite # 40 into a tent pad for site # 42.
- Site # 45, reconstruct campsite, repair water bibb, French drain and access route.
- Site #46, cut and pave spur parallel to roadway.
- Install rock lined drainage ditch and sediment basin in deleted campsite #50.
- Site #51, install swale at parking spur entry; drain to east side ditch and line with rock to tie in with existing drainage outflow.

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- Repair trail near site # 53, correct erosion problem, replace gable steps to lake access with rock steps; add logs to drainage area to slow run off flows.
- Rock line road edges from site #51 beyond sewage lift station.
- Site #55, improve/repair campsite access path.
- Site #57, remove excess rocks from campsite and grade.
- Repair existing overlook trail near site #56.
- Remove debris from existing rock lined drainage ditch near site #64.
- Site #69, construct and pave parallel parking spur, remove and rehab existing spur, remove excess rocks from campsite.
- Site #77, rebuild access steps.
- Build access path to existing water bibb across from site #80.
- Grade and compact with class 2 road base, all campsites and tent pads.
- Install asphalt swale at entrance to all parking spurs located off steep inclined camp roads and install 4-6" rock in ditches along camp roads at same locations to reduce erosion and sediment flow.

REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT: Project consists of the repair, maintenance, or minor alteration of existing facilities, involving no expansion of existing use; replacement or reconstruction of existing facilities where the new facility will be located on the same site as the facility being replaced and will have substantially the same purpose and capacity as the facility replaced; construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities; minor alterations in the condition of land and vegetation which does not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees; construction or placement of minor structures accessory to existing facilities (included as "construction or installation of additional public facilities") in the Department of Parks and Recreation's list of exempt activities, in accordance with CCR S 153.00.4.
