DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:

The proposed Project seeks to make necessary repairs to Historic Residence No. 4 at San Clemente State Beach. The Proposed Project's scope is to repair the damaged roof and bring the building into Americans with Disabilities (ADA) compliance by way of replacing an existing ramp and updating the restroom.

Potential impacts are minimal. All repair work will be done according to the Secretary of the Interior Standards and Guidelines for the rehabilitation of a historic resource. Changes to Residence No. 4's overall distinctive materials, features and spatial relationship shall be minimal.

REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT: No potential for significant impact to the environment is anticipated in compliance with § 15300.2. The project is exempt under the CDPR list of exempt activities according to CEQA § 15300.4 as class 1, 2 and 31. Class one includes the modification of existing facilities for handicap access. Class two includes the replacement or reconstruction of roofing. Class thirty-one includes activities affecting historic resources that are limited to maintenance, repair, stabilization, rehabilitation, restoration, preservation, conservation or reconstruction of historical resources in a manner consistent with the Secretary of the Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historical Properties with guidelines for Preserving, Rehabilitating, Restoring, and Reconstructing Historic Buildings. No substantial adverse change in the significance of this historical resource shall take place.
