DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:

In order to supplement recreational opportunities at Point Mugu State Park, this project will include the site design and installation of eleven prefabricated cabins and associated utilities for overnight use. Also included would be an ADA trail and associated habitat restoration. The project will be phased based upon available funding and would be located in two adjacent areas located along the southeastern edge of an existing campground. CDPR-approved standard project requirements have been incorporated into this project. REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT: No potential for significant impact to the environment is anticipated in compliance with CEQA §15300.2. If the project is implemented as indicated within the project description including conditions provided by specialists, then it is exempt under CEQA §15303–New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures. “Class 3 consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures. The project is also exempt under CEQA §15333–Small Habitat Restoration Projects. “Class 33 consists of projects not to exceed five acres in size to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement or protection of habitat for fish, plants or wildlife.
