PROJECT TITLE: Palomar Res 1 Septic Leach Field (PMSP 127)

LOCATION: Palomar Mountain State Park

COUNTY: San Diego

DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: The project consists of replacing the deteriorated septic leach field, tight line, and distribution box to the Residence 1 located Palomar Mountain State Park. The trenches in the proposed project area will be 24" to 36" wide and 18" to 36" deep. The number of trenches will depend on percolation test results. The proposed septic leach field will be located in the existing foot print of the current septic leach field. Excavation will be done using a backhoe and refilled with native dirt from the project area. There are no trees in the proposed project area that will be impacted.



REASONS WHY PROJECT IS EXEMPT: No potential for significant impact to the environment is anticipated in compliance with CEQA §15300.2. If the project is implemented as indicated within the project description including comments provided by CDPR specialists, then it is exempt under CEQA §15301 – Existing Facilities, §15302 – Replacement or Reconstruction, and §15304 – Minor Alterations to Land. The action falls under the Departmental List of Exempt activities according to CEQA §15300.4 as:

- "Utility repairs or minor upgrades" (Class 1, Section 15301);
- "Replacement or reconstruction of existing utility systems and/or facilities involving negligible or no expansion of capacity" (Class 2, Section 15302);
- "Minor trenching and backfilling where the surface is restored" (Class 4, Section 15304)
- "Minor public alternations in the condition of land, water and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees (Class 4).
