**PROJECT TITLE:** Torrey Pines Park Road Repairs (10-11-SD-54)

**LOCATION:** Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve    **COUNTY:** San Diego

**DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT:**

This project consists of the restoration of broken and fractured section of the historic asphalt and concrete roadway located in two general areas of Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve. The first area is located between the Entrance Kiosk and Visitor’s Center – three separate concrete patches will be required in this area with a total surface area of approximately 604 square feet. The surface will be removed to approximately 5 inches. The second general area is located on the concrete roadway between the Visitor Center and the Maintenance Yard – three separate concrete patches will be required in this section of the roadway and will have a total surface area of approximately 216 square feet. The broken and fractured concrete will be removed to a depth of approximately 10 inches below existing finished surface. The concrete patches will be poured with approximately 10 inches of “color matched” Portland cement and aggregate to match the existing historical roadway surface.
