


# Overview of Planning Process

- Document existing conditions
- Identify and inform stakeholders
- Identify issues and concerns
- Initiate environmental review process
- Evaluate significant resources, issues, constraints, and opportunities
- Develop alternatives
- Identify preferred alternative
- Circulate General Plan and Environmental Impact Report for public review

- 1 Storage area (Equipment / SCUBA / Sign)
- Paved road
- Miles of trails

## Special Considerations

- 180 Volunteer docents
- Strong financial support from Point Lobos Foundation
- Constraints of “Reserve” classification
- Limited parking
- Trail safety
- Native American sites

## Current Uses

- Day use
- Weddings
- Filming
- Dog walking
- Surf fishing
- Organic farm concession



# Carmel River State Beach (excluding Monastery Beach)

## Facilities

- 2 Barns (need stabilization)
- 1 Residence (needs stabilization)
- Dirt access road
- Two stairs accessing the beach
- Parking lot (currently closed due to erosion)
- Restrooms (currently closed due to erosion)

- Wetland habitat
- Lagoon and sand bar management with many concerned agencies and people
- Aquatic safety
- Steelhead habitat
- Annual residential flooding
- Natural beauty

- Special event area
  - Marathon, Pumpkin Patch, Christmas Trees.
- Barn yard lease (Event Area)
- Facilities
- Paved multi use trail
- Unimproved trail connecting Carmel Valley Road to Flanders neighborhood



# Hatton Canyon (Unclassified / Unnamed)

- Special Considerations
- Visibility and access from Highway 1
- Off-highway pedestrian connection from Carmel Valley Road to Carmel High
- Fire concerns
- Potential revenue

# Point Lobos Ranch (Unclassified / Unnamed)

## Current Uses

- Not open to the public.
- Maintenance material storage
- District trail crew headquarters
- Access to private residential area

## Facilities

- 7 Residences
- 2 Barns
- 1 Dirt road (San Jose Canyon)
- 1 Improved road (Riley Ranch Road / Red Wolf Drive)



# Point Lobos Ranch (Unclassified / Unnamed)

- Special Considerations
- Public access
- Parking
- Gowen Cypress Grove
- Spectacular views
- Significant Native American sites
- Historic district
