San Elijo State Beach Announces Concession Opportunity for Camp Store and Restaurant

SAN DIEGO, Calif. — The California Department of Parks and Recreation (State Parks) is accepting proposals from businesses to provide operations for retail and food services to visitors at San Elijo State Beach (SB) in San Diego.

Proposals are being accepted starting today, Aug. 9 through Nov. 14, 2024, for a 10-year concession contract for the operation of a store selling camping gear and providing food services to the public. Those interested in submitting a proposal can review State Parks' Request for Proposals (RFP) at parks.ca.gov/concessions. Proposal must be delivered in person or by mail no later than 2 p.m. on Nov. 14, 2024, to the California Department of Parks and Recreation, 715 P Street, 13th floor, Sacramento, CA 95814.
