

JACK LONDON STATE HISTORIC PARK

The museum in the House of Happy Walls—the house Jack London's wife, Charmian London, built—contains park information and exhibits. A nearby trail leads to Jack London's grave and to the remains of Wolf House, London's dream house destroyed by fire in 1913. The park contains the cottage residence where he wrote books, short stories, articles, and letters while he oversaw various agricultural enterprises.

Day Trip Option

A 3/4-mile walk takes visitors to a dam, lake, and bathhouse built by Jack London. Other hikes lead up through fir and oak woodlands to views of the Valley of the Moon.
