

CHINO HILLS STATE PARK

Chino Hills State Park is a premier natural open space in the hills around the Santa Ana Canyon. The park has more than 14,000 acres of rolling, grassy hills and valleys, dotted with stands of oaks and sycamores. Because of its great variety of habitats and microclimates, Chino Hills State Park is an ideal location for observing many wildlife species native to Southern California.

Day Trip Option

Chino Hills State Park's 43 trails are open to hiking, biking, and equestrian use and range from 0.8 miles to 16.5 miles long. The Telegraph-South Ridge Loop is a 7-mile trail through the canyon and up to the ridgeline overlooking the Santa Ana Basin (and on a clear day Catalina Island and Angel Stadium).
