Park Offers Free Whale Docent Training Class

MacKerricher State Park and the Mendocino Area Parks Association is offering a free, three-hour training course for those interested in joining the parks gray whale volunteer docent program. The training will introduce participants to the natural history of gray whales, including their amazing 6,000 mile annual migration, learn about the whale skeletons on display at the park, and how to teach park visitors about gray whales and other marine mammals.
