Samuel P. Taylor State Park's landscape ranges from shady canyon redwood groves to oak-studded grasslands to the rolling hills atop Mount Barnabe. Nestled in 2,882 acres of wooded countryside in west Marin County, the park invites visitors to camp, bike, ride horses and savor a piece of paradise.

PARK FEES are due and payable upon entry into the park. Use the self-registration system if the entrance station is closed. Fees include one vehicle. Extra vehicle fees are due and payable upon arrival.

OCCUPANCY: Six people maximum are allowed per campsite. Group sites and cabins have specific occupancy limits. Contact the park for site-specific information.

VEHICLE PARKING: Vehicles must be parked on pavement and at your assigned campsite. Two vehicles maximum per campsite. Additional vehicle parking may be available in the picnic area.

CAMPSITES: The main campground has over 50 campsites with restrooms, hot showers (token-only), and piped drinking water. Some parking spaces can accommodate small trailers (trailer max length is 27 feet; RV max length is 31 feet), but no spaces have hookups. Four wood cabins, each holding up to five people, are also available with electricity, platform bunk beds (bring your own mattress), wood floor, covered porch, and a small electric heater.

Four group campsites and one equestrian group campsite are available for reservations. At Camp Taylor, there is Madrone Group Camp (up to 50 people) and Orchard Hill Group Camp (10-15 people). At Devil's Gulch, 1 mile north of Camp Taylor, there are two tent-only group sites (up to 10 people each) and one equestrian group site (up to 20 people). The equestrian group site has a horse corral, hitching racks, and water troughs.

CHECK-OUT time is at noon. Please vacate your site by that time. Check-in time for campground is 2 p.m. Cabin check-out is at 11 a.m. and check-in is at 3 p.m.

SPEED LIMIT: The maximum speed limit is 15 mph. When pedestrians, bicyclists, and children are present, even 15 mph might be too fast.

BICYCLES are allowed only on paved roads and multi-use trails. Bicycle riders under age 18 must wear a helmet. Bicycles ridden after dark must be properly illuminated. Please ride safely.

DOGS must be kept on a six-foot-maximum leash and may not be left unattended at any time. They are allowed only in the picnic area, on the Cross Marin Trail/Bike Path, or in your campsite. Dogs are not permitted on any other park trails or fire roads, in the creek, or any undeveloped area. Dogs must be confined to a vehicle or tent at night. Please clean up after your pets.

QUIET HOURS are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Radios and other sound-producing devices must not be audible beyond your immediate campsite. To ensure an enjoyable experience for everyone, please do not disturb other campers, regardless of the time.

GENERATORS may only be operated between the hours of 10 a.m. and 8 p.m.

FIRES/FIREWOOD: Fires are only allowed in fire rings provided. Collecting dead or downed wood is prohibited. Firewood is available for sale at the entrance station and at camp host sites. All fireworks are prohibited.

PLANTS/WILDLIFE: All plants and trees are protected. **HAMMOCKS ARE PROHIBITED.** Poison oak is found in most of the park. Beware of ticks and yellowjackets. Wild animals explore campgrounds looking for food. Please store all food in provided lockers or in your vehicle. Improper food storage and/or feeding of wildlife may result in a citation.
