

WELCOME! This 5,272-acre park contains stunning views of Napa, Sonoma, and Lake counties from the summit of Mount St. Helena, the highest peak in the California wine country. On clear days, the Pacific Ocean, the Sierra Nevada, Mount Shasta, and Mount Lassen are also visible, and in the wintertime, there is ocassional snowfall to enjoy.

The area features rough terrain, with evergreen forests in the canyons on north-facing slopes and chaparral on the south-facing slopes. Visitors can see unique rock formations along the Palisades and Table Rock trails and can appreciate the size of the Sonoma Volcanics on the climb up Mount St. Helena. The Stevenson Monument Trail leads hikers to the site where Robert Louis Stevenson, the famous author of "Treasure Island," spent his honeymoon in 1880.

TRAILS

Hiking and biking are the main activities at the park. This large park has a variety of ecosystems and the two areas are very different in views and experience.

The trails to the north climb to the summit of Mount St. Helena, winding through Douglas fir, live oak, madrone, tanbark oak, and manzanita.

The trails to the south lead to Table Rock, the volcanic cliffs of the Palisades, spectacular wildflowers in the spring, and a connection to the Oat Hill Mine Trail and the outskirts of



Calistoga. While on the rugged Palisades Trail, visitors will see grassy hillsides, oak groves, and chaparral with amazing volcanic rock formations.

Note: Bicycles are allowed only on the road to the peak of Mount St. Helena and on the Oat Hill Mine Trail, not on single-track trails. No dogs allowed.

PLEASE REMEMBER

Limited Parking and Facilities— Limited parking is available. There is no potable water at the park and no restrooms on site. Lock vehicles and secure valuables.

Leave No Trace—No trash services available at this park, please pack out what you bring in.
