A Wintun-speaking native of Yolo County, she was kidnapped from her village, lived with the Suisun people, and was baptized at the Mission in Sonoma. She was the wife of Chief Solano and spent her last years with the Vallejo family. Open to the public at Mission San Francisco Solano Chapel, \$10 suggested donation.
