Pile Burning Operations to Begin at Trione-Annadel State Park

Sonoma County, Calif.—Text: California State Parks in cooperation with the CAL FIRE Sonoma-Lake-Napa Unit plans to conduct a series of intermittent pile burns at Trione-Annadel State Park, as soon as Monday February 10, 2025, and continuing Mondays-Thursdays through the winter and early spring months as conditions permit.

- WHAT:** Prescribed Pile Burns at Trione-Annadel State Park
- WHEN:** Beginning 02/10/2025 and intermittently till early spring 9 A.M. till 6 P.M.
- WHERE:** Warren Richardson Parking Lot, North Burma and Canyon Trails

WHY:

This work is part of the [park's prescribed fire program](#) and is being conducted to support ongoing vegetation management, roadside fuel reduction, wildlife habitat improvement and other long term stewardship efforts. These pile burns are intended to reduce dead and downed woody material along park roads, near the park boundary and in other strategic locations to reduce the severity of future fires in these areas and to improve first responder access.
