




Folsom Lake State Recreation Area Peninsula Campground

GENERAL INFORMATION

RATTLESNAKES are common to the area. They will not attack, but if disturbed or cornered, will defend themselves. Give them distance and respect.

POISON OAK is nearly everywhere in the park. "Leaves of three, let them be!"

ALCOHOL: The consumption of any alcoholic beverage is prohibited in all day-use areas and all shorelines of Folsom Lake and Lake Natoma.

SWIMMING: Always wear a life jacket or other flotation device when recreating around water or participating in water activities. Swim at designated beaches only, and if available, swim where a lifeguard is on duty. Do not swim in unfamiliar areas which may harbor dangerous currents, deep holes, debris, and other hazards.

DIVING OR JUMPING is extremely hazardous in unfamiliar water and against the law in a State Park. (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, 4656)

THEFT. Be sure to always secure your valuables.

PETS must always be on a leash no more than six feet long. Pets are prohibited on all designated swimming beaches. When camping, at night they must be confined in a tent, camper or enclosed vehicle.

BOATERS should be alert for floating debris and underwater hazards created as the lake draws down. Boating after the official closing hour is prohibited. To launch, all vessels must have a seal attached that meets the requirements of the Golden Mussel Prevention Program.

BOAT CAMPING is prohibited on shore. All boaters must check in at the Granite Bay kiosk or Browns Ravine Marina. See posted order number 690-003-2025 on the Folsom Lake webpage for more information.

FISHING. Fishing regulations change annually, check with the California Sport Fishing Regulation for current changes in the catch limits and licensing requirements.

CAMPGROUND RULES

ALL CAMPSITES ARE SUBJECT TO RESERVATION. Reservations are advised if you want to be assured there will be a campsite available when you arrive at the park. Any campsites not reserved are sold on a first-come, first-served basis one night at a time. Reservations can be made through www.reservecalifornia.com or (800) 444-7275.

THE CAMPGROUND AND ITS FACILITIES ARE FOR REGISTERED OCCUPANTS ONLY. Day use tickets, annual passes and Golden Bear passes do not apply towards campground registration. The use of the campground by unregistered people is prohibited. A maximum of 8 people per campsite is allowed, including children. Violators will be cited.

ASSIGNED CAMPSITE. Please camp in the site you have been assigned. Do not move from your assigned site without first checking with the Kiosk personnel.

CAMPING DAY LIMITS. Camping is limited to 7 consecutive days during peak season (15 off peak). Then persons and equipment must vacate that State Park unit for a minimum of 48 hours (2 days) before returning. Camping is limited to 30 days total per calendar year for any specific unit.

CAMPGROUND PARKING. Only two vehicles allowed per site (one vehicle, and one legally towed vehicle). They must remain on the pavement at all times. Extra vehicles and visitors must park in the overflow parking area. More than two vehicles in a campsite is prohibited and violators will be cited.

GATHERING FIREWOOD IS PROHIBITED. Please do not collect dead or down woods. Firewood may be purchased from the Camp Host.

FIRES MUST BE CONFINED TO STOVES OR THE CAMPSITE FIRE RINGS.

DISCHARGING DISHWATER OR OTHER WASTE ON THE GROUND OR INTO THE LAKES IS PROHIBITED. Wash stations are located at the bathrooms and a dump station is located within the park for waste and greywater disposal.

QUIET HOURS are from 10 PM to 6 AM. Generators may be operated from 10 AM to 8 PM. Radios and other sound-producing devices must not be audible beyond your immediate campsite regardless of the time, day or night.

CHECK OUT TIME is noon. If you wish to stay another night, please re-register at the kiosk by 10 AM.

PROBLEMS. Please advise the Kiosk personnel, Camp Host, or a Ranger of any problems you may encounter.

In case of emergency, call 911 and inform the operator which park unit you are at.
