# Mexican-California School Programs at Monterey State Historic Park

## Program Information

Fourth Grade students will experience the Mexican-California Rancho period (1821-1846) with fun hands-on learning. Topics covered are based on California Content Standards for Fourth Grade 4.1- 4.3.

Each program can accept class sizes of **34 students** or less and **one adult chaperone per six students is required.**

The program fee is **\$300** per class.

## Pacific House

Students rotate through 5 hands-on experiences:

- 1) **The Cooking Station-**  
See food preparation on the Rancho, churn butter, grind corn and make torillas to eat.
- 2) **The Embroidery Station-**  
Sewing and embroidery were important skills in the 1820s. Students will make a sample embroidered flower to keep.
- 3) **The Rope Station-**  
Discover the many uses of rope for the Vaqueros and sailors and make a jump rope the group will keep.

- 4) **The Branding Station-**  
learn the importance of cattle branding to the Rancho lifestyle.
- 5) **The Game Station-**  
Enjoy the games of the 1820s and make a button toy to keep.

## The Custom House

- 1) **Custom House Trade Skit-**  
Five predetermined actors will perform a short skit, "Mexican California at the Custom House" to their classmates.
- 2) **Hide & Tallow Trade Presentation-**  
See and learn which products were imported (cargo) and exported (cowhides and tallow) along the California coast during the Mexican era.
- 3) **Custom House Scavenger Hunt-**  
At the conclusion of the visit, there is a Scavenger Hunt and each student will receive a copy of a ship's manifest (list of goods) to take home.
