## California State Parks Seeks Public Input Regarding Concession Facility

SAN DIEGO — California State Parks seeks public input on the future of the concession located within Palomar Mountain State Park (SP) inside the facilities formerly known as the Palomar Outdoor School. A public meeting will be held on **Wednesday**, **June 25**, **at 3 p.m.** at Palomar Mountain SP, located at 14592 State Park Road Palomar Mountain, CA 92060.

Palomar Mountain SP features camping, picnicking, hiking, and fishing (trout) in Doane Pond. Coniferous forests cover much of the 1,862 acres, in contrast to the dry lowlands surrounding the mountain.

To better serve visitors at Palomar Mountain SP, State Parks will issue a Request for Proposals for a new concession contract through a competitive bid process. Input from the public meeting will aid officials in planning the concession's future facilities and operations.
