**National Register of Historic Places** nominations scheduled for action include:

### **Historical Resources Associated with African Americans in Los Angeles MPS**

*Multiple Property Submission documents as a group for listing properties related by theme, general geographical area, and period of time. The next seven properties listed are nominated under this document and meet the registration requirements of the MPS.*

**Angelus Funeral Home**                      **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Important as a successful commercial enterprise founded by African Americans in 1922. It occupies a 1934 building. It is associated with events that have made a significant contribution to broad patterns of history.*

**Fire Station #14**                              **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Significant as one of two segregated fire stations in Los Angeles before 1956.*

**Fire Station #30**                              **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Operated as a segregated Fire Station between 1923-1956.*

**Lincoln Theater**                              **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Significant theater in Los Angeles that catered to the African American community.*

**Prince Hall Masonic**                      **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Club building constructed in 1926 by Black Masons for African Americans.*

**Second Baptist Church**                      **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*Home of one of the oldest African American congregations in Los Angeles.*

**28<sup>th</sup> Street YMCA**                              **Los Angeles**    **Los Angeles County**  
*The leading organization working with African American youth in Los Angeles.*

**Donald and Helen Olsen House      Berkeley      Alameda County**  
*Significant work of an important figure in the history of mid-twentieth century Bay Area architecture*

**Merced Theatre      Merced      Merced County**  
*A 1931 Spanish Colonial Revival theatre that contributed to the cultural and social life of Merced*

**Roseville Carnegie Library      Roseville      Placer County**  
*1912 Carnegie library significant for its role in developing Roseville's civic culture.*

**Women's Athletic Club of Alameda County      Oakland      Alameda County**  
*A monumental Chateausque style building nominated for its importance in social history, women's history, and for its architecture.*

**National Register of Historic Places** nominations scheduled for discussion and action:

**First Baptist Church of Ventura      Ventura      Ventura County**  
*An example of the Mayan Revival style designed by Robert B. Stacy-Judd.*

**California Points of Historical Interest** nomination scheduled for action:

**Lindo Lake Boathouse      Lakeside      San Diego County**  
*Boathouse constructed in 1887 in the Richardsonian Romanesque style.*

**Oceanview Memorial Park      Oceanside      San Diego County**  
*Most significant non-denominational cemetery in Oceanside since 1895.*

**Scott House      Manhattan Beach      Los Angeles County**  
*Residence of high-artistic value and the first in Manhattan Beach to use I-beam construction*
