National Register of Historic Places nominations scheduled for action include:

Armour & Company Building San Francisco San Francisco County

Associated with the early twentieth century meat packing industry, and an example of early twentieth century warehouse architecture.

Eureka Theatre Eureka Humboldt County

Embodies the distinctive characteristics of Art Moderne architecture.

Fiddymment Ranch Complex Address Restricted

Important to the history of the Roseville area and continuously operated by one family from 1879 to 2004

Four Fifty Sutter Building San Francisco San Francisco County

The work of San Francisco architect, Timothy L. Pflueger characterized in a 1929 Art Deco commercial building.

Garment Capitol Building Los Angeles Los Angeles County

A 12-story industrial building constructed for the garment trade in 1926 by Florence Casler, featuring elaborate Gothic Revival details in terra cotta and ruffled brown brick.

One Lombard Street San Francisco San Francisco County

The work of Willis Polk illustrating his devotion to Classical architecture and his belief in decorative restraint to achieve lasting beauty.

Richard P. Doolan Residence and Storefronts San Francisco

A single-family home converted to a mixed-use retail/residential building after the great earthquake and fire of 1906, and a cultural icon of the Haight-Ashbury neighborhood during the cultural upheavals of the 1960s.



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California Theatre

San Bernardino San Bernardino County

Nominated for its important associations with theater development in San Bernardino and associations with Hollywood's "Golden Age."

SMUD Headquarters Building

Sacramento

Sacramento County

An exceptional example of International/Miesian style of post-WWII Modernism.

USS Macon, Airship Remains

Address Restricted

The underwater archaeological remains of the 785-foot USS Macon are associated with the demise of the US Navy's lighter-than-air airship program.

Westlake Theatre

Los Angeles

Los Angeles County

A 1926 movie theater featuring a Spanish Rococo exterior and a Renaissance/Adamesque interior, designed by Richard Bates and updated by Art Deco/Moderne theater designer S. Charles Lee.
